PEACE AND JUSTICE COMMITTEE INVITES THE PUBLIC TO AN INFORMATIVE FORUM, DEC. 14—

The Peace & Justice Committee invites the public to an informative forum at CMCL, from 5-6:30 p.m. Wednesday, Dec. 14, called Don't Overbuild: A Townhall on Right-Sizing the New Jail. Experts will discuss best practices in bail and other criminal justice procedures that could assure that the new Lancaster County jail is fiscally responsible and no bigger than necessary. Lancaster County plans to spend \$150 million on the new jail, making it the largest county-financed construction project ever.

Presenters will include Michelle Batt of Lancaster Bail Fund and the Rev. Jason Perkowski of POWER Interfaith. Invitees include the county commissioners, the warden, the district attorney and the president judge.

Some of the questions that will be addressed include:

- How can bail reform reduce the number of people languishing in jail before they get to trial?
- How could a stronger commitment to pretrial services impact the need for a large jail?
- What is the evidence that public safety isn't at risk when fewer people are detained before trial?
- What data will consultants use to determine the size of the new jail? Is the consultant considering how best practices could safely reduce the prison population?
- What can Lancaster County learn from Berks County's decision to understand how mental health programs can reduce the size of the jail planned there?
- Does it make sense to have a work-release program that allows qualified inmates to work for eight hours in the community, then return to sleep in jail?

The ACLU has sued Lancaster County, alleging unconstitutional bail practices. If the ACLU wins, what impact would the outcome have on the size of the new jail? The townhall is timely because CGL, the county's project consultant, is presenting a draft needs assessment at the Dec. 15 prison board meeting. The needs assessment will be the basis for decisions about the size and design of the jail. The county plans to hire an architect this winter, and groundbreaking is slated for Spring 2024.

KEY/FOB UPDATE— A number of FOBs are currently in circulation that are not identified with an authorized user. These FOBs are being disabled. If you discover that a FOB you have been using does not work, contact the church office to have the FOB associated with your name re-enabled.

CMCL ONLINE PHOTO DIRECTORY— According to ChurchTrac, there will no longer be a separate online photo directory on the CMCL website. The photos are now included in the Online Directory. However, each person will have to log in to Church Connect and allow their photo to be displayed. When an individual is listed on the Online Directory, only their name, and the names of their immediate family members (with the exception of children), will be listed. Members must then individually opt into the Online Directory through Church Connect for any of their information to be visible, including their family photo. 
GRANT STREET BUILDING WORKDAY— The ad hoc Grant Street Construction
