REPORT ON SPECIAL DELEGATES MEETING - A special delegates meeting for the Atlantic Coast Conference (ACC) was held 2/4/23 at Forest Hills Mennonite Church. (ACC congregations are geographically spread from Massachusetts to Maryland.) The topic was whether the conference will credential candidates from the LGBTQIA+ community. CMCL's delegates who attended were: Laurel Martin, Paul Allen, Pauline Zimmerman and Pastor Leslie Homer-Cattell. In addition, Christy Heatwole Kauffman was part of the prayer group for the gathering.

Delegates gathered at about a dozen tables with each table consisting of delegates from various congregations. We heard the history of this discernment process, as well as current

statements of support and/or concern from 25 of the 30 congregations. About a third of the congregations are completely on board with moving forward with credentialing qualified candidates who are from the LGBTQIA+ community. A handful of congregations have various concerns. Some said they will follow the leading of ACC. And another handful are still in the discernment process themselves.

Delegates discussed what we heard in the congregational statements and how God is evident in this process. We were also asked to provide counsel to the Ministerial Leadership and Executive Committees who expect to make a final decision by the end of February.




GRANT STREET BUILDING UPDATE
