

#### DECISION ON LGBTQ+ CREDENTIALING BY ACC'S MINISTERIAL LEADERSHIP

#### **COMMITTEE-**

The members of ACC's Ministerial Leadership Committee wish to share our appreciation for the engagement of member congregations and individual delegates regarding credentialing. After careful discernment of listening to God's Spirit through the diverse feedback from delegates and congregations and with affirmation of Executive Committee we have come to the following decision:

The Ministerial Leadership Committee will respect the position of each congregation to request, or not to request, the credentialing of an LGBTQ+ person (including someone in a same-gender marriage) and will process the request.

Concluding the discernment process is not the end of ongoing connection and care for one another as conference members. We invite congregations and individuals into ongoing engagement with one another in these ways...

- 1. Hold all ACC congregations in our prayers continually.
- 2. Seek creative congregation-to-congregation and pastor-to-pastor interaction to enhance understanding with those who hold different views. The conference office can help facilitate these times if needed.
- 3. Continue processing differences of opinion with your congregation. Understanding differences both in- and outside the congregation can help us better love and care for one another. Again, the conference office may be called on if resourcing is desired.
