Corey Franz-Eby—I will be sharing about my parents, Delton and Marian Franz. My father, once a pastor on the south side of Chicago, was chosen to be the first to lead Mennonite Central Committee's Washington office. His work spanned from the Civil Rights Movement in the US to Peace Treaty signing for the Middle East. I will also talk about my mother's work with the Dunamis organization to The National Campaign for a Peace Tax Fund. Since they have both been gone for more than 10 years, I will try my best to recall my knowledge of their work as a child to a young adult.

Barbara Gascho—I will be sharing a story from the life of my great-grandmother, Susanna Heatwole Brunk. She was separated from her husband, a conscious objector, who fled during the Civil War. She and her infant, bravely journey many miles looking for him and miraculously finds him.

Donna Stoltzfus—I will share some family stories from the WW2 time period, from both the U.S. and Europe.

Lynn Sommer—I will tell the story of my aunt who was a nutritionist in a CPS Camp during WW2 and her finance's work in alternative service, in Poland, bringing Russian Mennonites to safety.
