CONGREGATIONAL LETTER FROM CHURCH COUNCIL

We are currently six months into the 2018-19 church year and it is time for an update. I also want to remind everyone that all of the council minutes and financial reports are on the CMCL website.

Goal Setting

Leslie organized a half-day retreat for council and staff to get to know each other better and to begin the process of working on the 2020-2025 CMCL goals. Look for more details and ways to participate in the goal setting process soon.

Financial Update

As of February 28, 2019 total giving was \$263,816 which is slightly more than 50% of budget. Although this appears to be good news we must remember that most of the giving historically comes in during the first half of the year. Offerings for 2018-19 are \$19,057 behind last year's giving. Based on last year's second six month's giving we are projecting a **deficit** of more than \$50,000. The offerings for the first three Sundays in March averaged about half of what is needed to meet our budget!
