April 28 Urbane Peachey: "A Century of War in Palestine"; Urbane wrote his Master's Degree Thesis at University of Pittsburgh on the political relationship between the Government of Jordan and the people of Palestine in 1970. He was involved in administration of emergency relief and development work in Jordan, Egypt, West Bank and Lebanon from 1970-1986, resident in Lebanon and Jordan from 1970-75 with Gwen and three school age children.

May 5 Jonathan Kuttab: Present day Israel/Palestine interactions — Jonathan Kuttab is a Palestinian human rights lawyer and peace activist. Jonathan grew up in West Jerusalem and Bethlehem. After the Six Day War (June 1967), Kuttab's family moved to the United States, where he graduated from Messiah College and earned his law degree from the University of Virginia. After practicing with a Wall Street law firm for several years, in 1980 Kuttab returned to his homeland where he continues to practice law and work for peace and justice.
