4/28/19 in the Sanctuary: April 28 Urbane Peachey: "A Century of War in Palestine"; Urbane wrote his Master's Degree Thesis at University of Pittsburgh on the political relationship between the Government of Jordan and the people of Palestine in 1970. He was involved in administration of emergency relief and development work in Jordan, Egypt, West Bank and Lebanon from 1970-1986, resident in Lebanon and Jordan from 1970-75 with Gwen and three school age children. First of 2 Sundays on Palestine, Background: Arab Nationalist uprising against the Ottoman Empire, under British sponsorship during WWI, a 28 year tug of war tug of war between Palestine Arabs, Jewish militias and British Mandate authorities, United Nations division of Palestine-1947, the 1948 war—The Nakba=catastrophe; refugees, the burning of MCC's warehouse in Jericho, assassinations, organization of PLO and Palestinian militias, 1967 war-followed by 52 years of Israeli Military governance of West Bank and Gaza.
